How to Plant Radishes

- 1. Acquire a tray of six-pack planting containers.
 - a. If your experimental methods call for something else, acquire the specific kind of planting tray that you'll need.

- 2. Add soil to the planting trays so that it is flush with the top of the tray.
 - a. Lightly pat the soil if loose to ensure proper soil compaction.

3. Make a pinky-fingernail-sized depression in each compartment of the six-pack planting tray.

a. Each of the six compartments of the six-pack tray should have one depression only.

4. Add ONE radish seed to each fingernail-sized depression.

a. Each compartment should have only ONE seed.

5. Fill in the soil on top of the seed. Pat lightly with your hand.

One seed per compartment!
6 seeds per six-pack.



- In an outside location with drainage, lightly water the soil so that it is moist (not soaking wet).
- 7. Label your radish trays with your...
 - a. Hour
 - b. Group Number
 - c. Treated or Control labels
- 8. Move your radishes to the appropriate location for your experiment as indicated by your instructor.
